

Jean-Robert Alexis was born in 1980. He learned painting and drawing in the studio of Ismael Saincilus, who remained his model. He lives and works in Haiti. Settled in the Grand Rue following the death of his mother, he continued his studies at the Lycée Pétion then at the Lycée Fritz Pierre-Louis, to join the National School of Arts (ENARTS) in 2012 where he followed three years of initiation to the arts plastics. He frequents the artists of the "Atis rezistans" Movement while continuing his practice of painting, which tends to assert itself more and more. Inspired by ancient history, pre-Columbian history as well as the mythology and divinity of these ancient cultures, he develops his own language, his own plastic codes. In 2015, Jean-Robert Alexis took part for the first time in the Ghetto Biennale in Port-au-Prince and had his first solo exhibition in February 2017, at IERAH (ISERSS): Apparition et Métamorphose des dieux tutélaires. This exhibition and its integration into the artistic and social movement "Nou pran lari-a" allowed it to emerge on the contemporary Haitian scene. In 2018, his work evolves, he creates nightmarish, macabre, disfigured characters and dinosaur heads, snakes, etc. Jean Robert Alexis participates in several workshops at the Center d'Art, including "RE-VIZITE" in 2018, he participates in a creative workshop inspired by the collections of the Center and which will give rise to an exhibition presented at the Center d'Art et at the French Institute of Haiti.

Dominik was born and raised in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Her love for children led her to study Childhood Education and around that time she noticed her passion for visual art. In 1982, she took private drawing classes and that became her new hobby. Fast forward 18 years, in 2000, Dominik started to paint with a private teacher and over the years, she took acrylic and oil techniques classes at Miami Dade Community College. For years, she has dedicated herself to her family and her professional life. Now more than ever, she decided to free herself from other obligations and reveal her creative side to the world by making her artistic career her priority. She is now a full-time artist living in Miami Florida with her family. Dominik works primarily with acrylic on canvas and wood panels but also with oil, collage, and mixed media. Her paintings appear to be roving between reality and fantasy, sobriety and phantasmagoria, decency, and insanity, with some sort of African and Haitian flavors at once. Dominik's creations evoke images of valiant women, ritualistic ceremonies, pilgrimage, and throng people seemingly in trance as seen during Mardi-Gras season and queen-like figures harboring majestic postures. Always reinventing herself, Dominik has grown tremendously as a talented and prolific artist. Her body of work has changed and showed remarkable maturity. Her deep intuition, unconventional flair, skillful ways of handling the palette knife, and love for heavy impasto, drive to the creation of paintings that are vivid, appealing, and meaningful.

In 1997, she pursued technical and artistic training at the Ottawa School of Arts and won a prize at the French Institute followed by an invitation to the Ecole Nationale des Beaux-Arts in Paris. In 2006, she attended an artistic residency at the 'Bag Factory' in South Africa, and in 2011 she represented Haiti at the 54th Biennale in Venice. Her work has been shown in North America (New York City, Miami, Pittsburgh, Washington DC, and Montreal), in Caribbean Haiti, Martinique, and the Dominican Republic) as well as across Europe (Paris, Berlin, Venice, Brussels, Lyon, Luxembourg) and in Africa (Johannesburg).

His paintings are done in series and phases that are carefully thought of and tell stories around themes of joy, spirituality and societal preoccupations. Clifford has participated in both individual and group exhibitions in public spaces and has work in private collections all over the world.

David Boyer was born in Port Au Prince, Haiti on January 6, 1976. His natural curiosity for art began to develop at a young age. When he was 12 years old, he started to work in the workshop of Tibout, making sequenced voodoo flags. It was there he mastered sequence art, and began to help other artists develop their techniques. Boyer began to work closely with Pierrot Barrat, in the Iron Market along with other artists and artisans. In 1995, he joined forces with Lherisson Dubreus and both began to explore their own individual creative inspiration setting them apart from the rest of the artists they knew. Soon after they co-founded the Kongo Lawouze workshop. In 2006, David Boyer began exploring a new form of art which was a marriage of all the previous experiences he had acquired including his new found passion for recuperation art. In 2008, he held his first collective exhibit at Galerie Monnin with three other Haitian artists-Pasko, Dubreus, and Senatis. Afterwards, he began to work closely with Barbara Prezeau Stevenson, artist, historian, and founder of Africamerica. He exposed at the Georges Liataud Museum in Croix des Bouquets. In 2011, his career took an international turn, and he participated in his first exhibit abroad at the Little Haiti Cultural Center in Miami, under the wings of art curators Edouard Duval Carrie and Mireille Gonzales. David Boyer was soon after invited to participate in exhibits in New Mexico, Canada, France, and Cuba. David Boyer continues to expose in various exhibit spaces in Haiti including MUPANAH, Atelier Jerome, and Kolektif 509. David Boyer currently lives and works in Bel Air.


SAMD I is a contemporary Haitian artist based in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. His work described by the artist as Sen Soley. Painting from a rhythm. A space where self is looking inwards and possibilities are endless. His work consists of cubist style portraits and a semi abstract approach to figuration. Self exploration and the understanding of the spirit as a human in this space are at the core of SAMDI's artistic practice. His work can reflect deep emotional trauma and at the same time express the beauty of love. The artist lets the audience be the author of their experience as they have to search inwards to make sense of what they are viewing or feeling. SAMDI has had numerous international group exhibitions. Some of those include CORNERSTONE (Paris Texas LA Gallery (Downtown Los Angeles, California 2018), Carifesta (Trinidad and Tobago National Museum and Art Gallery, Trinidad 2018), Roots of The Spirit (Artserve Fort Lauderdale, Fort Lauderdale, FL 2019.), Surface Issues (MOCA Miami, North Miami, FL 2019). 

Philippe Dodard, was born in 1954 in Port Au Prince. At a young age, he studied with the Haitian masters Jean-Claude Garoute (Tiga), Patrick Vilaire and Frido Casimir - founders of the Poto-Mitan School. In 1973, he began his academic studies at the Academy of Fine Arts in Port-au-Prince. During this time, he worked as a layout artist and founded a studio of audiovisual graphic arts. In 1978 he received a scholarship to study at the International School of Bordeaux, France where he focused on pedagogic graphic design. After the popular uprising against dictatorship in Haiti in 1986, his style completely changed from his much lauded, fluid water imagery to much stronger strokes of black and white inks, coated paintings, wooden totems and metal sculptures reflecting the 'Cry for Freedom' of the Haitian people. Between 1992-1999, he became co-founder and President of the socially conscious Fondation Culture Creation. Dodard was also the Cultural Adviser for the First Lady Elisabeth D. Preval, and the artistic leader of Plas Timoun, a psycho-social project created for the relief of children affected by the earthquake of January 12, 2010. He was instrumental in the reconstruction of the iron market in Haiti as the project chief for Arts & Ambiances. In 2011, after meeting Donna Karan and Russell James in Haiti, Dodard began his collaborations with Urban Zen and Nomad Two Worlds. His paintings inspired Donna Karan's 2012 Spring collection and led to a joint exhibition at the Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCA), in North Miami Florida. Dodard is the Director of Haiti's only public arts school, ENARTS. Dodard lives and works in Port-au-Prince.

Dubreus Lherisson was born in 1971 near the second largest city in Haiti, Cap Haitien. When he was young, his mother relocated to Port au Prince and settled in the Bel Air area near the house and temple of Tibout, a Vodou priest and flag maker. At the age of 14, Lherisson joined his mother in Bel Air and entered the “Lakou” circles – sacred places of worship and voodoo practice. He would spend a lot of his time at the temple of Tibout, and it was there he began to participate in the workshop as a flag maker. In 1994 Tibout died and Lherisson along with fellow Haitian artist David Boyer took over the workshop and continued to make flags. Later on, Lherisson began to act as an agent for some of the sculptors who worked in the Iron Market. After his meeting with the famous artist Pierrot Barrat, Lherisson entered a multidimensional world, and transitioned from artisanal production to artistic creation. In 2010, Lherisson became involved in “Recuperation Art”. Along with David Boyer, they founded the “Kongo Lawouze” workshop, in Bel Air. Lherrisson has participated in over a dozen of expositions in Haiti, Dominican Republic, and Miami.



He later studied drawing at the Center of Arts in Port-au-Prince and attended workshops at "Kayytiga"- a gallery and cultural center created by Saint Soleil co-founder Jean-Claude "Tiga" Garoute. It was here Killy submerged himself in the "Artistic Rotation" approach, which was a method that allowed students to explore freely between various mediums from clay to ink to paint, and much more. He participated in artistic residences in Martinique, Benin and Montreal. Since 2001 he has continued to show his work in various exhibits throughout Haiti (Atelier Jerome, Galerie Monnin, Kolektif 509) and abroad including Montreal, Barbados, Martinique, France, and the U.S. (Washington D.C. and Miami). He also participated in the expo "Haiti Kingdom of This World" which was a traveling exhibit between Jacmel, Miami, and the Venice Biennale. Killy currently lives and works in Haiti.




Born in 1984 to an artist mother, Françoise Hazel grew up in an aesthetically inventive universe. She developed an instinct for recycling very early on. After her studies in international relations, she turned to interior design where she rediscovered a sensitivity for materials that respect the environment. Her concern for ecology motivated her to launch "Ca Cartoone" in Haiti, her country which faces critical environmental issues. In 2013, she was director of the Georges Liataud Museum for the Africamerica Foundation where she had the opportunity to collaborate closely with other artists using recycled materials. It was there that she was inspired to take her art further by incorporating other mediums, including cut iron. In 2015, she was approached by the Kolektif509 to exhibit her furniture. In 2017, invited again, she made the decision to submit her artwork. Françoise has exhibited her works in Guadeloupe, New York, Miami and Haiti.

Born in 1967, Jean-Baptiste Jean Joseph is from la Vallé Beinet in the southern part of Haïti. Involved in Haiti's Folk art movement from an early age, he learned to weave baskets and also took jobs factories, applying beads and pearls to wedding dresses. In 1991, he decided to start his own business with a small loan from a friend. He created his first voodoo flag, stitching everything by hand and promptly selling it for \$450. From the beginning, he had a unique style, which he says came to ho him in a revelation. Rather than fill a flag completely with beads and sequins, he likes to create contrast by leaving the background sparse while filling the center image thick with a variety of new-style beads. He started out by selling his flags to the museum of Haitian art gift shop in Port-au-Prince, and went on exhibit his work in some of the island's finest art galleries. Today, he uses a sewing machine and employs several artisans to make his creations, which can take 2 to 6 weeks to complete. His flags have been exhibited in galleries in Haiti, New-York, Miami, California, Australia and Paris.


Born 1972 in Port-au-Prince, Nazaire Pierre-Louis whose artist name is Nazito is the son of the famous Haitian painter Prosper Pierre-Louis who was one of the great artisans of the movement Saint Soleil. He made his painting debut at his 18th birthday in 1990 at the workshops of his father, Prosper Pierre-Louis. With a strong will on his part, he was admitted to Colombia from February 1997 to December 1999 at the University of Bogota Jorge Tadeo Lozano where he was debuting in Fine Arts. In December 1999, he met Tiga who was the main leader of the Saint Soleil movement. From 2000 to 2002 Nazaire Pierre-Louis attended painting classes at the TIGA Workshops; he put into practice everything that this great master had advised him. His works are exhibited throughout Haiti (Embassies, non-governmental organizations, private and state institutions, and abroad.




He attended Pratt and F.I.T. and has been documenting Haiti in all its glory which has been his central focus since the mid 1990s, mostly in the form of still photography. In early 2000's, he photographed child labor and women's rights in Mali for UNICEF. He has documented the numerous facets of life in Haiti from the aftermath of the 2010 earthquake for the Save The Children, and making music videos for Haitian Artists. When he decided to chronicle Jacmel's Carnival, he knew the moving image would be integral to do it justice. Christopher's Haitian roots run deep, especially in Jacmel where his mother and her family are originally from and many of his relatives still live today. Through his personal connections to the city, he has had the rare opportunity to gain firsthand access to some of the unique individuals that contribute to Jacmel's core essence. However, cultural traditions are rapidly deteriorating in this modern, globalized world. Gentrification and a shortage of new historians interested in preserving Jacmel's historical continue to threaten the city and its Carnival for future generations living in the digital realm. How are we to safeguard our exuberant history and traditions if no one is replacing the historians who keep that alive? His contribution is the documentary, Kanaval Jacmel. He is also, working on a second documentary about vodou and the annual vodou ceremony that takes me in Gonaives, North of Haiti.



Pascale Monnin was born in Haiti in 1974, of Swiss parents. At the age of three Pascale moved with her mother to Yverdon, Switzerland. Although she grew up in Switzerland she is also irrevocably Haitian, having maintained intimate ties with the island through annual summer trips back home. By the age of 13 Pascale was enrolled in art school learning to draw from live models. Fully entrenched in the artworld throughout her teens she apprenticed and collaborates with the sculptor Ljuba Stoyanovic who taught her how to sculpt miniatures in stone. She learned the art of etching on copper plates in Lausanne at the Atelier Aquaforte. At this same time she earned her « Baccalauréat artistique » at the Collège Voltaire in Geneva. After that Pascale engaged in numerous artistic activities : participating in a group show of copper etching ; creating interior design for nightclubs ; costume designing for Les Brandons d'Yverdon carnival; restoration of paintings and frames at Ramon Rivas's atelier in Lausanne. In May 1994, Pascale returned to Haiti to help her father run his well-established gallery « Galerie Monnin » in Pétionville. The magical and mystical aspect of Haiti has a very strong influence on Pascale's work but with the years she created her own mythology that lives in her paintings. She not only paints but also sculpts iron and works with several other haitian artists in a live model studio she began in early 1999.

Valerie Noisette is a Haitian-American artist who was born in Queens, New York in 1982. She spent the majority of her life in Chicago, and later moved to Miami. Since she was a child, she always had a fascination with Haiti and knew that one day she would find her way to the land of her ancestors, where she truly felt at home. In 2010, she moved to Haiti right after the earthquake. This move marked the beginning of her spiritual quest as a visual artist and led her to explore a different dimension of her existence. Noisette found herself creating mystical and spiritual depictions of the world beyond time and space. Her artwork is meant to spark an internal dialogue with its viewer, encouraging the exploration of the world beyond our physical reality using elements of sacred geometry and symbols. The intangible world she attempts to explore is one which is based on feelings, emotions, energies, and higher forces that are at the very seat of our soul. Noisette has participated in several local exhibits, and her artwork was featured in an international exhibit in South Korea. In addition, Noisette co-founded Kolektif 509, and has exposed the works of over 80 artists in various exhibits throughout Port Au Prince and abroad. Noisette currently serves as Executive Director for Hope on a String, a community based organization based in Arcahaie, Haiti which uses the power of arts to strengthen and build communities.

Jerry Rosembert Moise is a graffiti artist born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti in 1984. He became interested in art early on in life. Which led him to follow his dream and study art at ENARTS (The National School of Arts) There is where he learned the techniques of plastic art. Jerry's artistic focus was pop culture and caricatures.

While in art school Jerry volunteered as a drawing instructor with children from the ghettos of Carrefour-Feuille alongside the Haitian association Exchange. After seeing vulnerable children suffer from food insecurities, becoming orphaned, and being exposed to gang violence, as well as experiencing one of the most natural disasters in recent history, affected Jerry deeply. He immediately went into action and the Port-au-Prince graffiti artist Jerry Rosembert Moise came to prominence as one of Haiti's leading social activists. When many of the neighborhoods where he'd painted before the earthquake were reduced to rubble, Jerry took to the walls of Pétionville, an affluent area home to the Haitian elite and to many foreign NGOs. . In dozens of murals around the city, his artistic focus shifted from pop culture caricatures to upbeat portrayals of Haitians and of Haiti's future, bearing slogans like "I love Haiti" and "Haiti will not perish." As it drew crowds in the street, Jerry's work was admired and attracted many. It became, for many Haitians, a rare symbol of resilience and strength at a dark period in the country's history.

Jean Eddy Rémy was born in 1976 in the village of Noailles, a former sugar plantation in Croix-des-Bouquets. Self-taught, he develops graphic writing more and more personal. Of more, in contact with the Master sculptor and Togolese designer, Kossi Assou (Transcultural Forum 2006, Haiti; Ewolé 2008, Togo), Jean Eddy Rémy began to question the tradition of cut iron. His gesture freed from drawing, now values the recovery sheet in the state raw. It is exhibited in several Caribbean countries, in Europe, in the United States as in Africa. Jean Eddy Rémy, as a true culture activist, is President of the Association of Artists and Craftsmen of Croix-des-Bouquets (ADAAC), member of the Foundation Africamérica and founding member of the SELIDE cultural center in Croix-des-Bouquets which brings together artists of all tendencies : visual artists, musicians, people from theatre and dance. From 2004, Jean Eddy Rémy, participate as a trainer in various Foundation activities Africamérica, targeting young people and the children. Jean Eddy Rémy is a young leader of the community of sculptors from Noailles to Croix-des-Bouquets. His dynamism, his hyperactivity, its ability to create links between individuals, communities, cultures, countries, allowed it to exceed the multitude of obstacles hindering the creation in Haiti. In 2009 He obtained the prize of the Ordre de la Pléiade awarded by the Parliamentary Assembly of La Francophonie at the 6th Games of the Francophonie in Lebanon for the quality of his work. In 2012 he obtained from the organization international GRAHN-World the Excellence in Craftsmanship award. In May 2013, as part of the launch of the week of Europe organized at the Institute French from Haiti, he presents two works at the sculpture festival.

The 2010 earthquake triggered a need for creation in her. She studied drawing, charcoal, watercolour and painting from 2011 to 2014 with Dimitri Devilmé from Dimarts. Subsequently, she reinforced her training by participating in different visual and creative arts exploration workshops with the artist painter Paskö (Pierre Pascal Mérisier). At the Haïti’s Art Center, she took courses in engraving, calligraphy and participated in the art criticism workshops organized around the exposition “*Archipelago*”. She also was part of the “*Creating Together, Carte Blanche to Pasko*” workshop organized in 2021. Several themes run through Teeyah's work. In an abstract language, she explores the human being in his spiritual evolution: illusions, sufferings, wounds, duality, compassion, empathy and finally the letting go. Since her exhibition as a guest artist at the Art Basel Miami 2017, “*Art Festival*” by the Art and Design Gallery, Teeyah has been exhibited in Haiti, the United States and Canada.
